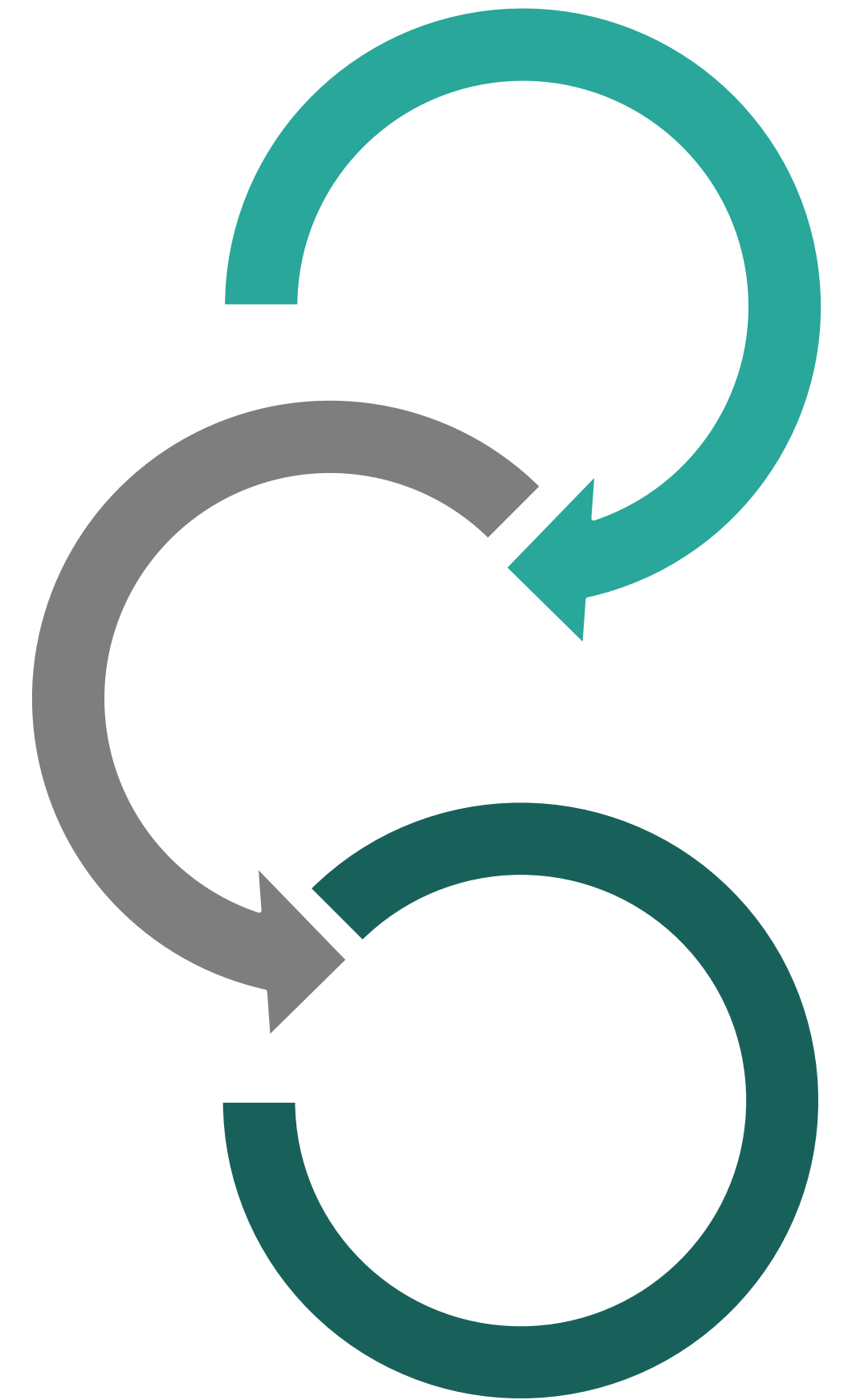

Current Environment

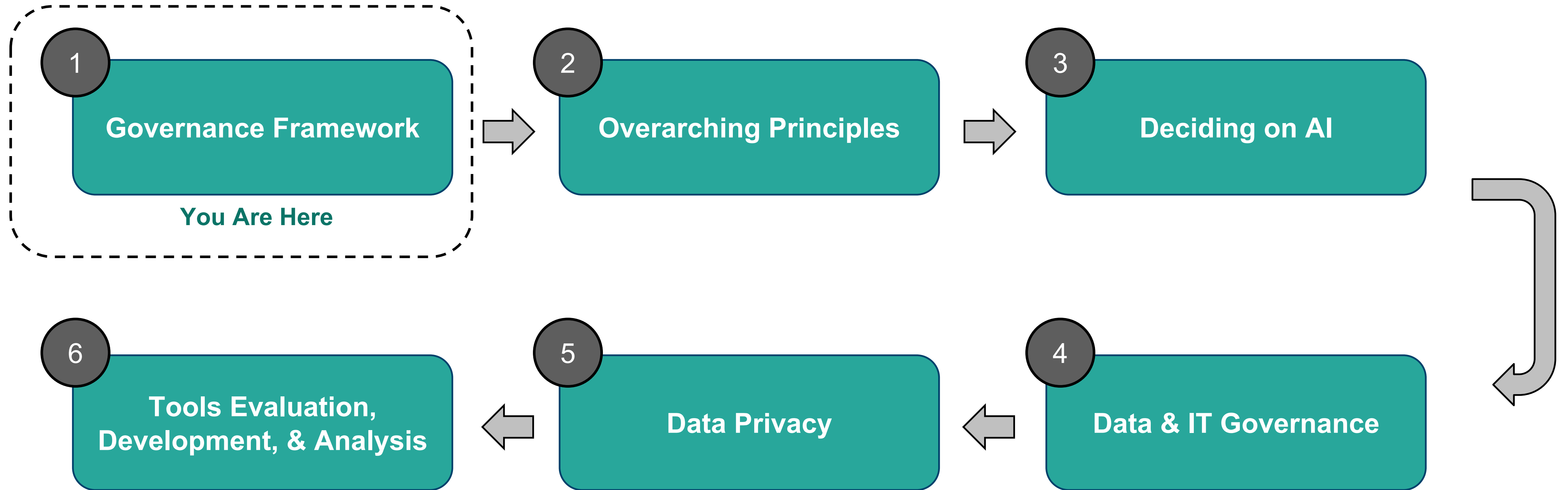
- Many conversations about AI – the good, the bad, the ugly
- Pressure to adopt AI and to manage internal AI use
- Ongoing conversations about guardrails and guidance
- Resource constraints as nonprofits tackle ambitious missions

Six modules will guide you through important considerations for nonprofits when implementing AI

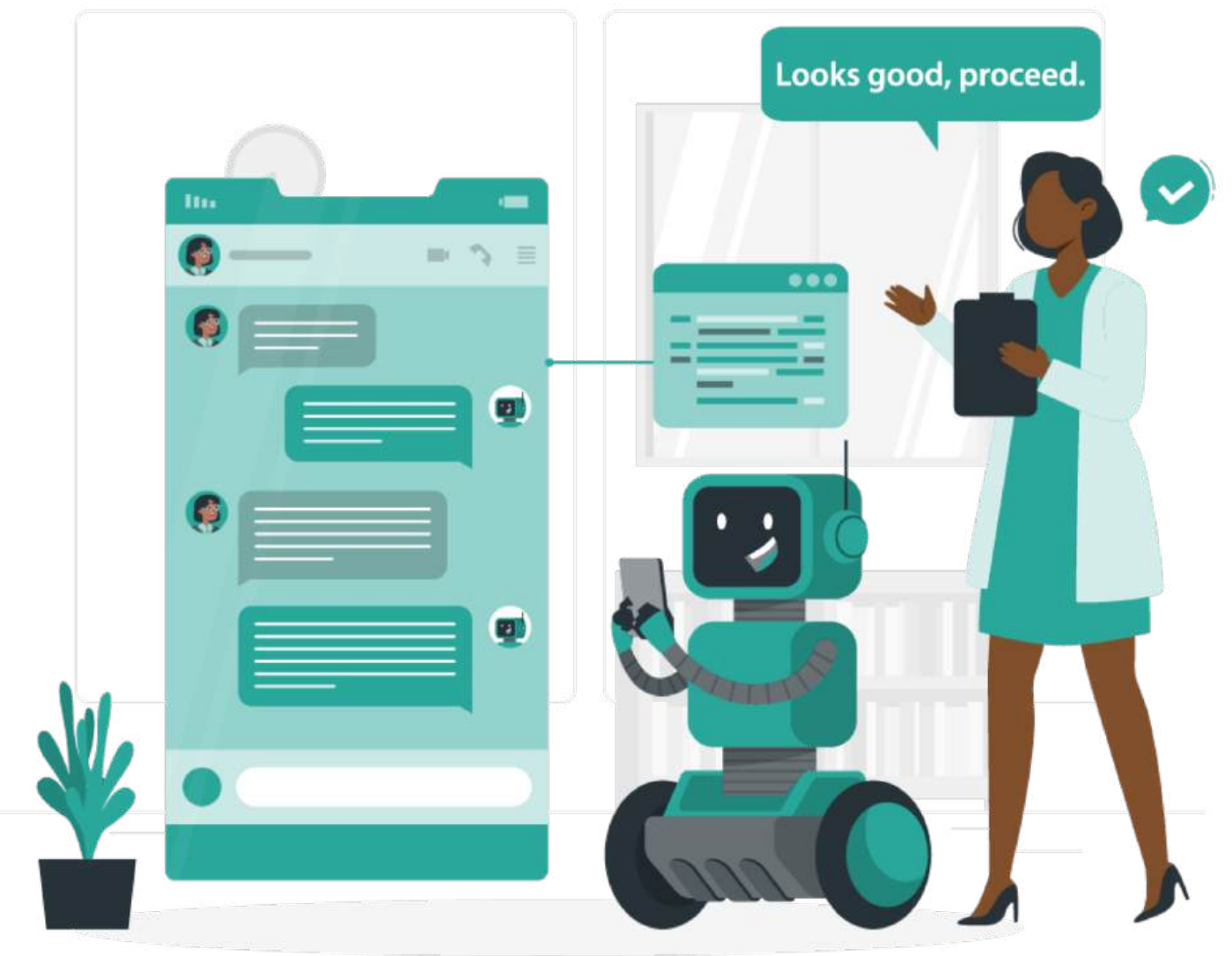


At the end of this training, you will be equipped to take the next step in AI implementation for your organization

Board Talking Points: discussion points to be used, along with this presentation, in conversations with your board about AI

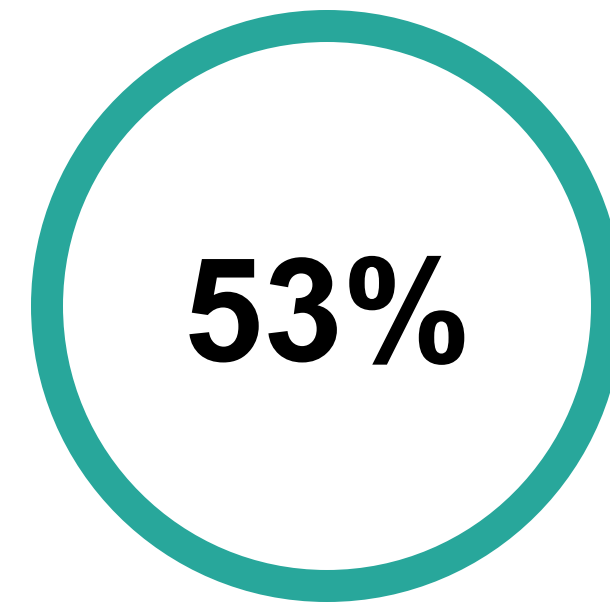


Nonprofit workers are at all ends of the spectrum on AI usage, though the majority are unsure how to use



Of nonprofit workers were identified as power users

Compared to 29% in all other industries



Of nonprofit workers said they were unsure of how to use AI

Compared to 40% in all other industries



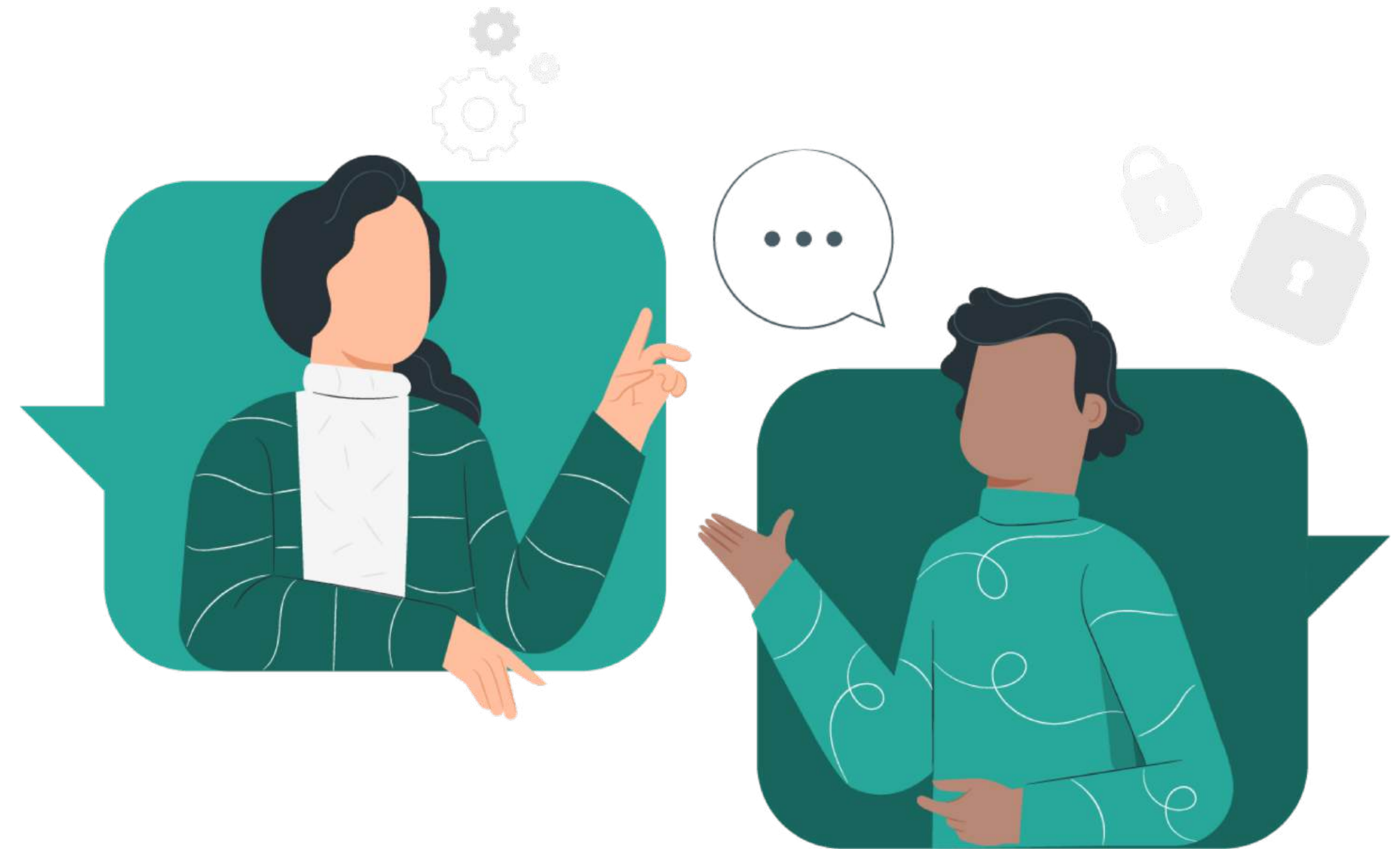
Of nonprofit respondents said they had one-time training

Compared to 9% in all other industries

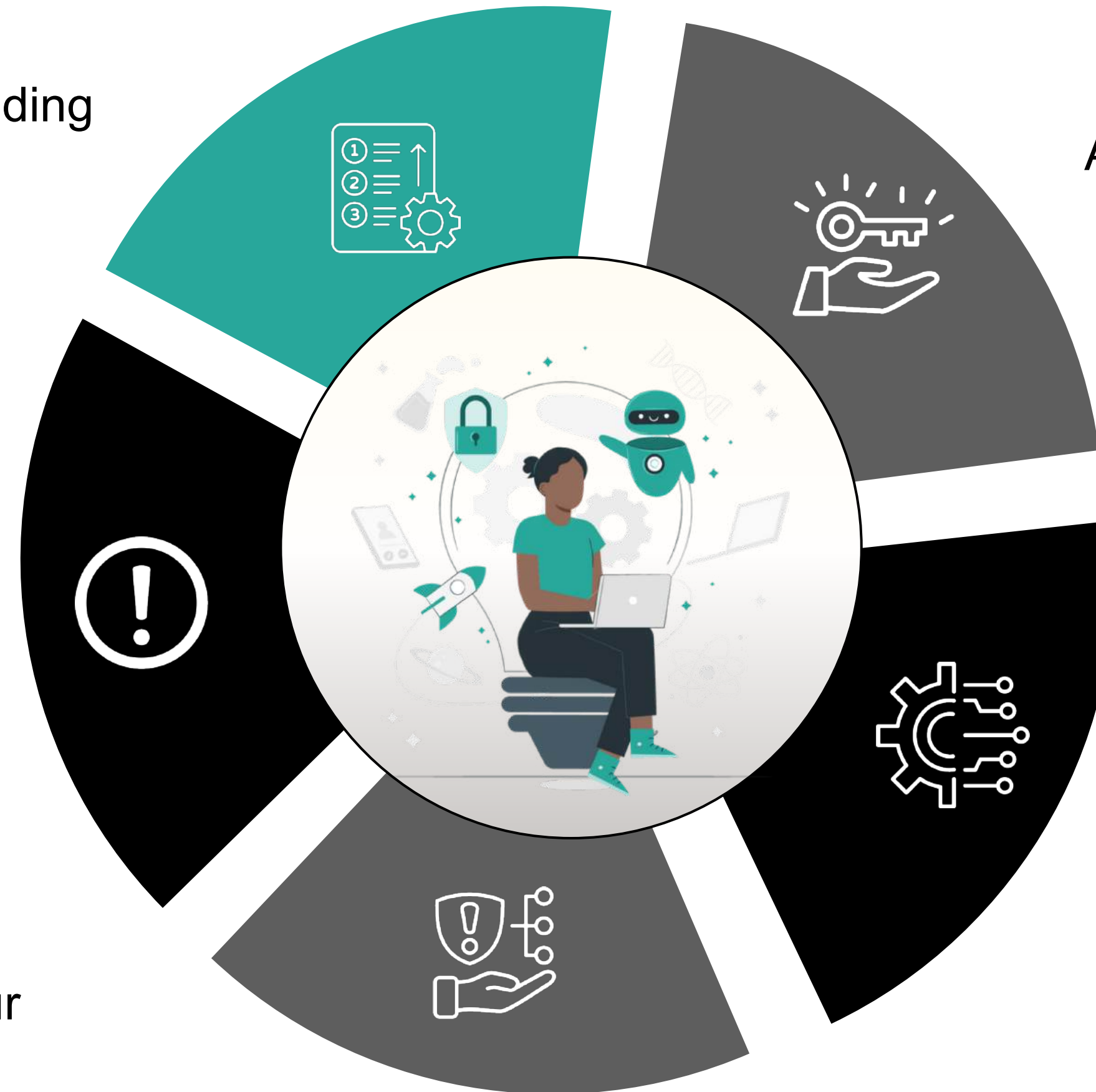


The time to implement AI policy is now

Nonprofits have many priorities, including many technology-related priorities

AI tools aren't perfect, and there are aspects of the technology that still need to be figured out

Unmanaged AI tools can expose your organization to new risks



AI can also provide an opportunity to do new things, or to do old things in new ways

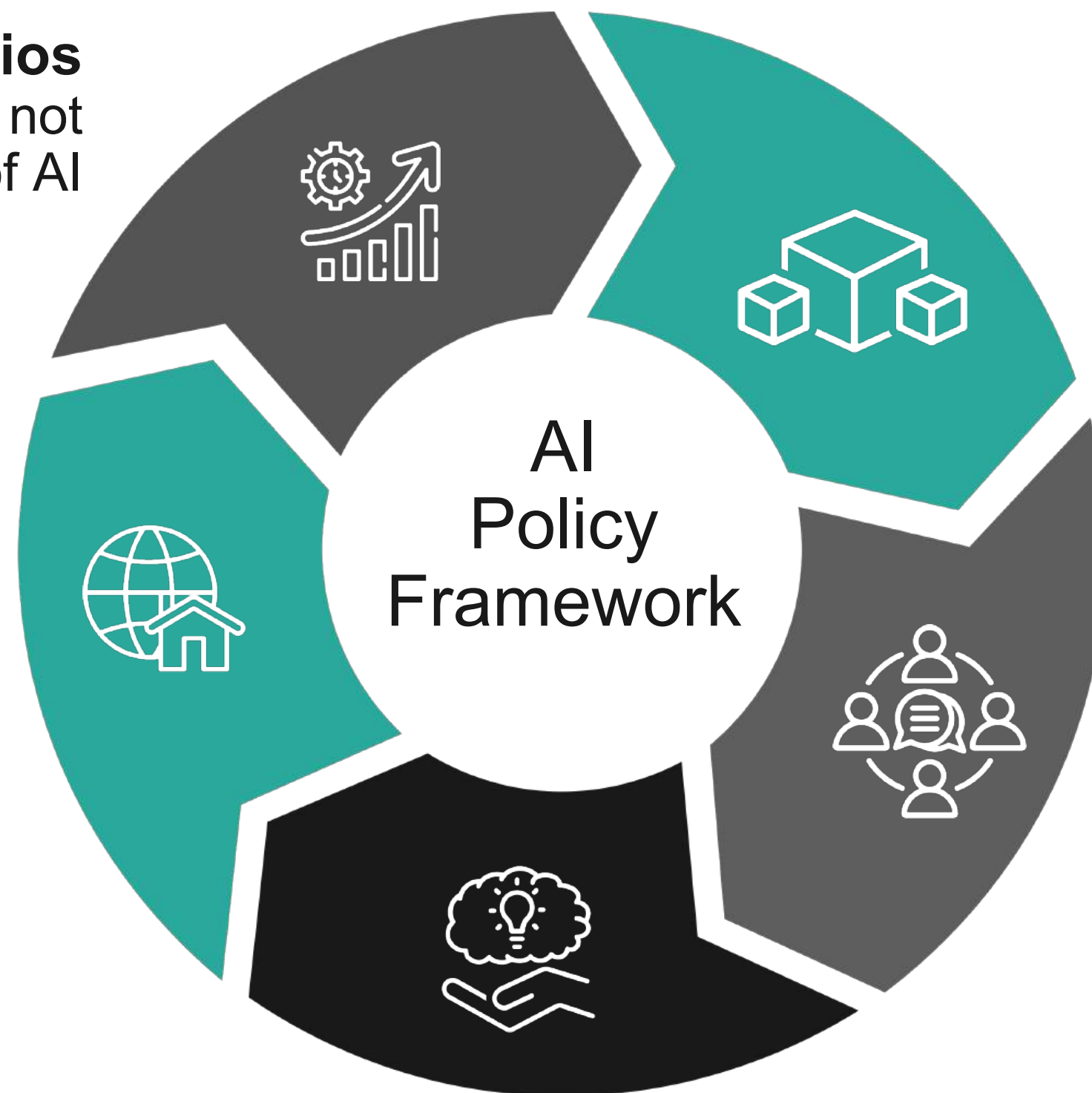
AI tools and functionality are becoming more prevalent; many nonprofit staff report using AI tools at work

How can organizations balance creativity and responsibility?

We have developed an AI policy framework that is relevant, modular, and community-informed

Productivity-driven scenarios
Situates AI in service of organizational mission; not for the novelty of AI

Community-informed approach
Nonprofit leaders from myriad organizations contributed to this framework

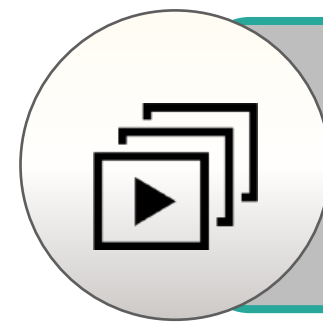


Modular design
Allows the selection of relevant sections/ language based on your organization's preferences

Anchored in real-world use cases
Provides real world use cases as concrete examples of how and where to consider AI

Easily understood and usable
Communicated in clear language, appropriate for various audiences

This training includes two components, video overviews and downloadable documents customized based on your current AI implementation status



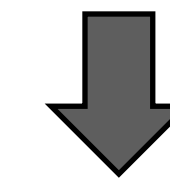
Video Series

Include a brief description of the function, roles, and objectives, as well as sample language for a policy

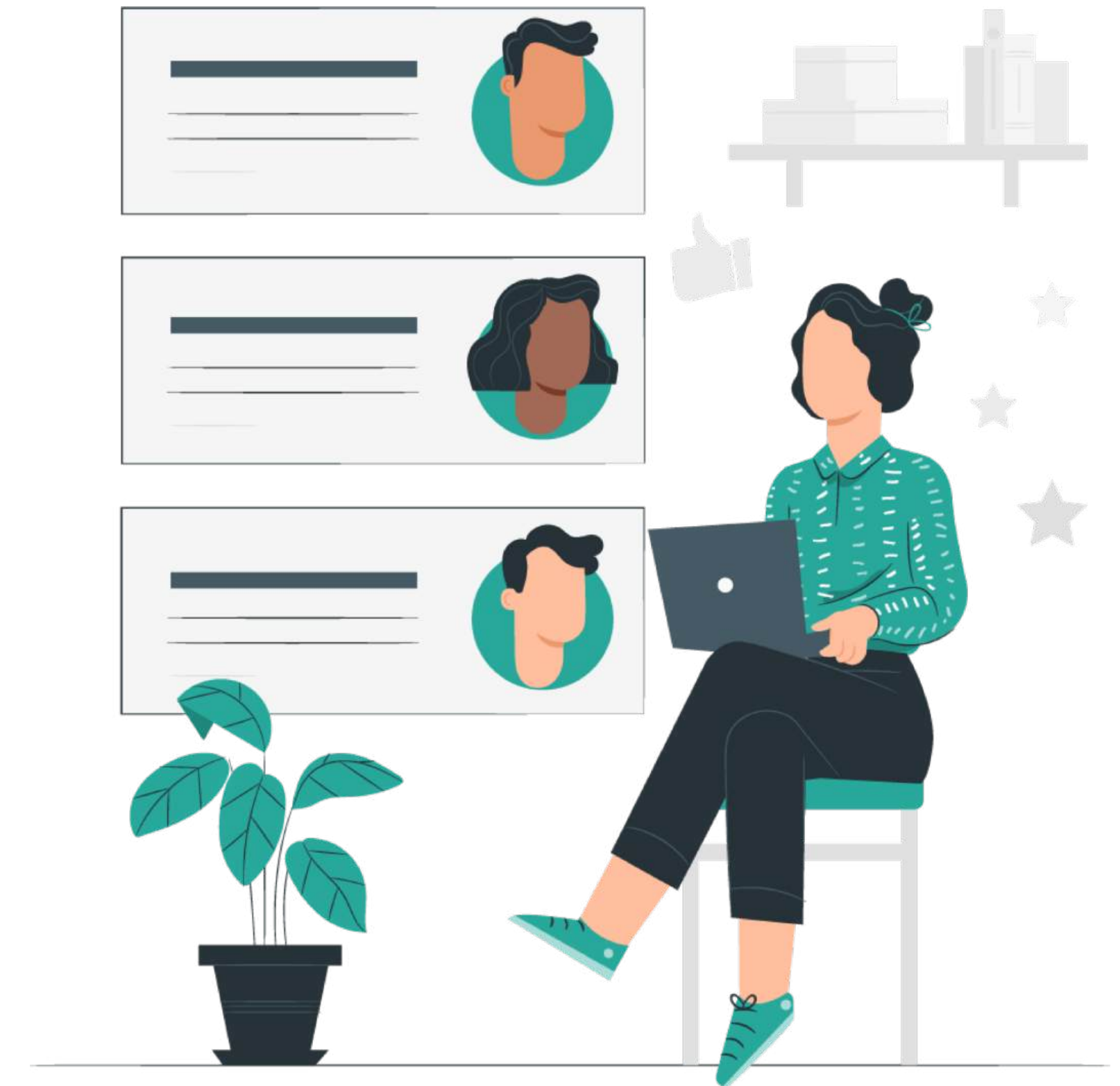


Select sections based on your organization:
